## DEPICTING SIGNS - EXTENT HANDSHAPES

Practice signing the sentences in Auslan.

TIP 1: *Don't forget to sign what it is first, before using a depicting sign for it.*

TIP 2: There is an Auslan video showing these sentences being signed using depicting signs. You may like to watch the signer and copy how they sign it.

<b>1</b>	<i>The water was full in my cup</i>
<b>2</b>	<i>I drank, and the water decreased in my cup</i>
<b>3</b>	<i>I poured more water in the cup, and it filled up</i>
<b>4</b>	<i>I folded clothes, and there was a small pile of folded clothes</i>
<b>5</b>	<i>I folded some more clothes, and the pile of clothes became bigger</i>
<b>6</b>	<i>I didn't know where to put the large pile of clothes!</i>
<b>7</b>	<i>I was disappointed when I saw a very small heap of food on my plate</i>
<b>8</b>	<i>I was delighted when I saw a large heap of food on my plate</i>
<b>9</b>	<i>I tried to find a book on a bookshelf full of books</i>
<b>10</b>	<i>There were so many bookshelves full of books, I couldn't find the book I wanted!</i>
<b>11</b>	<i>There was a small group of people walking</i>
<b>12</b>	<i>More people joined the group and the group became bigger</i>
<b>13</b>	<i>I saw a line, it became longer, and soon there was a very long line of people!</i>
<b>14</b>	<i>It rained continuously and the water kept rising and became a flood</i>
<b>15</b>	<i>The flooded waters rushed by</i>
<b>16</b>	<i>The sun came out and the flood receded</i>
